Administration

- Session 2 of New Kent University was held, featuring the offices of the Commissioner of Revenue and Treasurer. Session 3 next week will feature Fire-Rescue and will be held at Fire Station One.
- Continuing to field inquiries about the PPEA proposal on the Historic School
- The Government Access Channel, Cox Ch. 48, is still down, but the equipment has been fixed and returned to us and will hopefully be up and running the first of next week.
- Welcomed Dominion Virginia Power volunteers involved with a beautification project at the historic school
- Met with the new director of the Chickahominy Health District

Community Development

- The New Kent Bike Route signs have been installed throughout the county.

- Completed Community Service Day Project with Dominion Virginia Power. The group sent 27 volunteers to complete the following projects: installation of plants, trees and shrubs; installation of field identification signs; building of ball field benches; and began painting project in the gymnasium lobby. The group also donated \$2,500 to support the project. Many thanks to Mr. Lawton, Mr. Trout, and Mr. Burrell for attending the opening comments, and to Mr. Evelyn and the Extension office for support/assistance. Publicity in several publications.
- Started the Fall Soccer League for Youth ages 6 – 12.
- Started the 2010-2011 Before/After School Program at NKES and GWES.

Social Services

- A Benefit Programs case was reviewed by Quality Assurance, and no errors were found. Thanks and appreciation goes to the Benefit Programs staff for their diligence and hard work.
- The Services Staff will be attending several trainings throughout the month of September to gain knowledge about Virginia's new Family Engagement Initiative. This initiative is a relationship focused approach that provides structure for decision making and empowers both the family and the community in the decision making process.

Meetings of Interest:

- The Director and Services Supervisor will be attending a General Assembly meeting to discuss Kinship Care in small localities such as New Kent. Kinship Care is the full time care, nurturing, and protection of children by a relative.

Statistics of Note:

- The Office of Comprehensive Services approved 12 invoices totaling to \$15,387.65.
- Currently there are 41 open Services cases, including Child Protective Services, Foster Care, and Adult Protective Services.
