Motion was made by Mr. Burrell, which carried 5:0, to adopt the following resolution:

## A RESOLUTION CHARTERING THE NEW KENT COUNTY CLEAN COUNTY COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors recognizes that New Kent County has a need to promote litter control; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors wishes the citizens of New Kent County to be aware of and involved in the development of litter control within the County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors desires to incorporate the County's recycling program into its Environmental program;

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors charters the New Kent Clean County Committee.

## Charter

The Committee shall be known as the "The New Kent County Clean County Committee."

<u>Purpose</u>. The Committee's purpose is to promote the cause of a cleaner, more attractive community through litter control and recycling.

<u>Public Body</u>. The Committee is a public body for the purposes of the Virginia Freedom of Information Act.

<u>Duration</u>. The Committee shall exist until January 31, 2020 unless the Board of Supervisors renews the Committee's charter before that time.

<u>Membership</u>. Each District Supervisor shall appoint one member to the Committee. In addition, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint two at-large members.

Each district member and each at-large member shall serve four years in staggered terms. Vacancies shall be filled by the Board of Supervisors for the unexpired term only. Members shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for expenses necessarily incurred in the performance of Committee business.

<u>Staff Sponsorship and Liaison</u>. The Environmental Programs Manager shall serve as the liaison to the Committee.

<u>Duties of the Clean County Committee</u>. The Clean County Committee has a duty to the citizens of New Kent County to promote the cause of a cleaner, more attractive community. The Commission also has the duty to:

- Develop litter control programs for which state litter control grants can be expended.
- o Conduct publicity campaigns and educational programs on litter control.

<u>Powers of the Clean County Committee</u>. The Clean County Committee may engage in the following activities in order to fulfill their duties:

- o Promote law enforcement as it relates to litter, programs for the removal of litter, placement of anti-litter signs, litter containers and programs including recycling.
- o Promote the preservation of trees and the encouragement and support of beautification projects undertaken by various organizations.
- O Spend public funds for the promotion of a cleaner, more attractive county.
- o The Committee may create its own internal rules and regulations.

Officers. The Clean County Committee three (3) officers: a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, and a Secretary. The Committee shall elect the Chairman and Vice-Chairman and elect or appoint the Secretary at the first meeting of each calendar year. The Secretary need not be a member of the Committee. Each officer shall serve a one (1) year term.

<u>Duties and Powers of Officers</u>. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings, make committee appointments, work closely with or serve as the local coordinator for environmental programs within New Kent County. The Chairman shall also carry out other duties as may be assigned by the Committee. The Vice Chairman shall perform any of these duties in the Chairman's absence or incapacitation. The Secretary shall keep the records of the Committee.

Meetings. Regular meetings of the Clean County Committee shall be held monthly on the second (2nd) Tuesday of the month at 6:00 p.m. in the New Kent Administration Building beginning with the Annual Meeting of the Committee which shall be the first meeting of the calendar year. The Committee shall have the power to postpone or reschedule a regular meeting as needed. The Chairman shall have the power to call a special meeting. The Chairman shall give ten (10) days notice before calling a special meeting unless a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the members present at such a special meeting agree to bypass this notice requirement.

Quorum. A majority of the members of the Clean County Committee shall constitute a quorum.

<u>Voting</u>. A decision on new business shall be made by a majority of all members. All other decisions shall be made by a majority of members present and voting. All votes shall be made by voice vote with the Chairman casting the last vote.

<u>Procedure</u>. Except as otherwise specified, proceedings of the Clean County Committee shall be governed by the most recent <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u>. An appeal from a ruling of the chair may be taken by any member and shall be determined by a majority of those members present. The Chairman shall be permitted to make motions and vote on all questions. Meetings of the Committee shall proceed in the following order: Call to order, Roll Call, Approval of Minutes, Unfinished Business, New Business, Adjournment.

Subcommittees and Working Groups. The Chairman shall appoint a Chairman of all committees established by the Committee within thirty (30) days of that committee's creation. The Chairman of each committee shall then appoint the members of that committee. Before becoming members, the committee chairman's appointees will need a majority vote of the Committee.

<u>Funding</u>. The Clean County Committee is funded by a grant from the Department of Environmental Quality. They may also ask for donations. They are not authorized to use public funds.

<u>Fiscal Year</u>. The Fiscal Year of the Clean County Committee shall run from July 1 to June 30.

Required Reports. The Clean County Committee shall present an annual report of the Committee's activities to the Board of Supervisors thirty (30) days after the close of the fiscal year.

Amendments. Any amendments to the Charter shall be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for approval.

Effective Date. This Charter of the Clean County Committee is effective upon passage.
